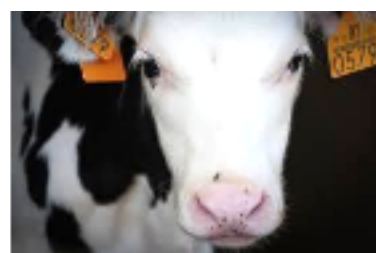


# HELP!!!
